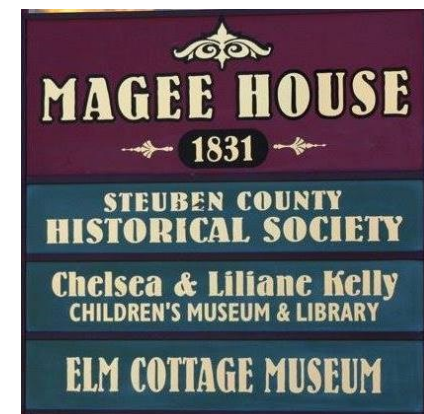

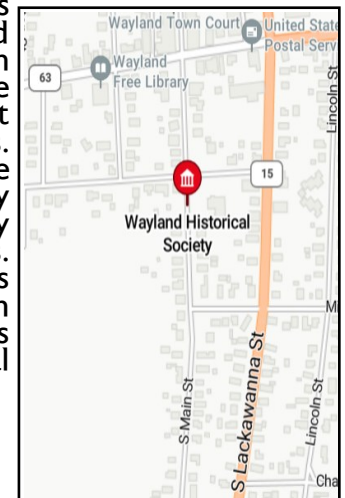

The Wayland Historical Society building, located at the corner of Washington and S Main Streets, sits on land once owned by Martin Kimmel I. He first came to America in 1847, from Bavaria. He operated a steam saw-mill in that area. In 1878, the village fathers voted to erect a small jail on that land. Soon after, a blacksmith shop and wood working shop were added. Still later, John Morsch had a nearby grain and feed mill and eventually a building which housed a truck sales and service business. The Morsch Motors car dealership was next to the Fleet Service building.

The organization of a Historical Society was begun in 1992 and the Fleet Service building was purchased in 1994. Work began and over the years, the property has been updated and added to each year. We now have a newly added pavilion that was built by local teachers and students. The Gunlodge caboose graces the museum grounds. Once owned by Howard Gunlocke, it has been lovingly restored and is a favorite with visitors.

The museum is open on Sundays from 2pm to 4pm from April through December. It is also open on Mondays from 10am to noon, or by special appointment.

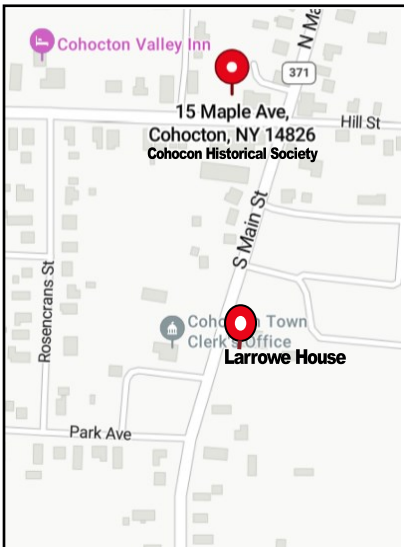

Built circa 1882 by T.S. Crosby, it housed the Crosby Furniture Store as well as the village's undertaking parlor, a common combination in the 1880's. T.S.'s grandson Thomas J. inherited



the businesses upon his return from service during World War I. In 1946 the undertaking business was sold to Shepherd-VanPatton who operated it until the 1960's. After being empty for a number of years, the Cohocton Historical Society purchased it in 1981. Renovations included the installation of the staircase, rescued from a house in Campbell. Besides the trail days, the Building is open the 1st Saturday of the month, April through November.

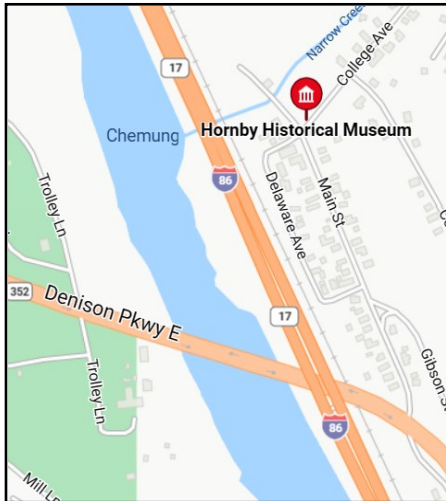

The Hornby Museum was once a one-room schoolhouse that was built in 1876. Our collection of artifacts contain photographs of the families, homes, shops, schools and churches of Hornby. We have extensive genealogies, old diaries (one contains an entry of 1865 when President Lincoln was shot), vintage clothing, antique tools, etc.

Parking is available across the road from the Museum at the Hornby Congregational Church. Our antique tool collection is on display in the fellowship hall of the church.



The hornby museum is open Sundays in July and August from 1-3 pm or by appointment. For appointment call 607-962-5775

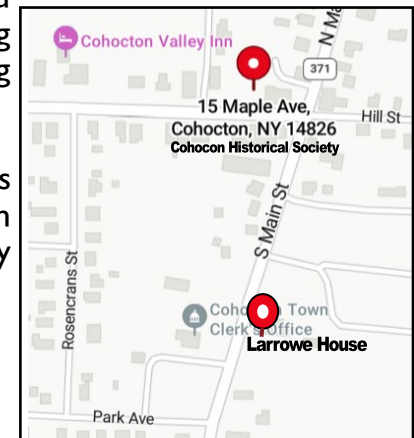

Built 1856, the Larrowe House was the primary residence of the Larrowe family for many years. It was given to the Town of Cohocton in 1948. Before it was purchased by the Society in 2009, it housed various town and village offices as well as several civic organizations. The house is Italianate revival, and although it is wood, it appears to be stone through a process called "rustification". With a grand central hall and open staircase, it was befitting the Larrowe family. Albertus II, who built the house, was the founder and president of Larrowe Mills, growing it to the largest buckwheat milling company in the world.

Besides the trail days, the House is open the 3rd Saturday of the month April through November and by appointment.

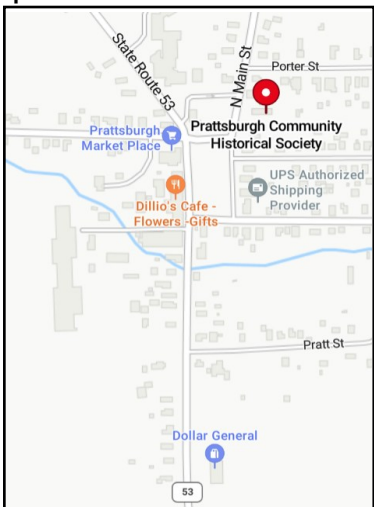
Built in 1848, this home across from the Prattsburgh Town Park is a wonderful example of early fine home construction in Prattsburgh. It is said that the hand rail on the curved staircase was taken down, steamed and recurved four times to ensure a precise fit. The home was owned by Thomas Van Tuyl, W.B. Merritt and until recently, Judy and the late Hugh Fullerton. The Prattsburgh Community Historical Society is now the proud owner of this beautiful, historic house in "downtown"

Prattsburgh, thereby ensuring its preservation for generations to come.

The Museum is open for tours on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month from 11:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. beginning in June: June 8 & 22; July 13 & 27; August 10 & 24; September 14 & 28.

Painted Post-Erwin Museum at the Depot

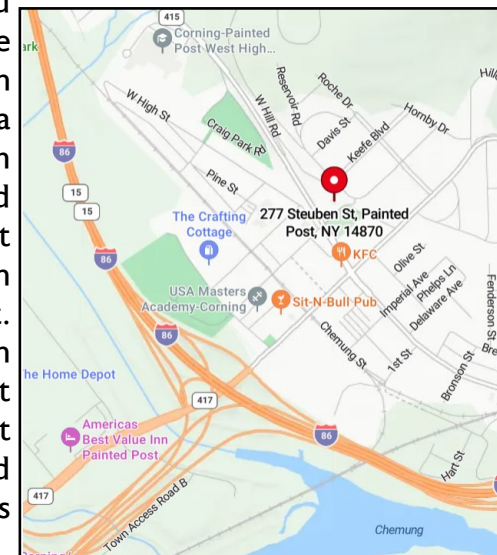

The Depot was built by the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad. It provided passenger and freight service in the Southern Tier. The prefabricated building was delivered on rail and erected on its current site in Painted Post between 1881 and 1882. It was used by the railroad until 1954. The building was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1991. It has been restored and equipped to house the Painted-Post Erwin Museum. The memorabilia and artifacts in the museum largely come from the old Town of Erwin Museum that was housed in the Erwin Town Hall on W. Water St. in Painted Post, as well as on-going donations. It is part of the Corning-Painted Post Historical Society and operated on a seasonal basis and by appointment.

The name Middletown once encompassed the now towns of Addison, Cameron, Rathbone, Tuscarora, and Woodhull. In 2009, MHS acquired 41 Main Street, Addison, New York, an 1875 former, mercantile brick building, for their museum.

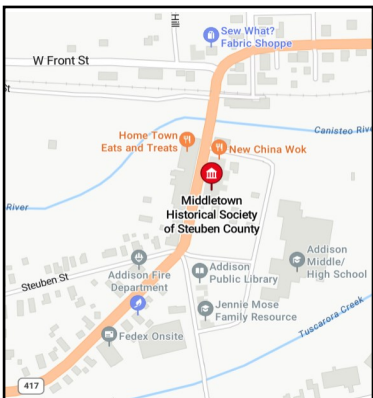

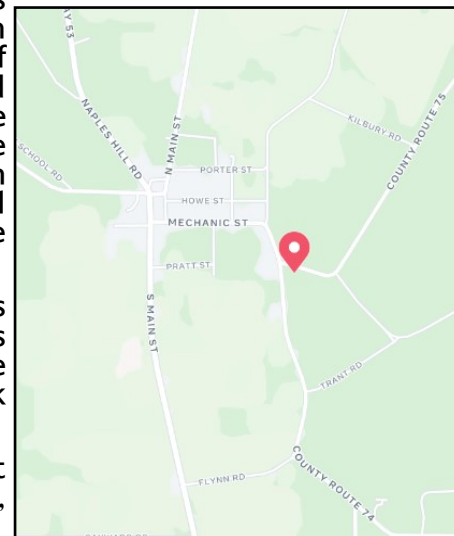
Narcissa Prentiss' birthplace, the house contains artifacts, quilts, antique clothing, and a room dedicated to the Pratt family, founders of Prattsburgh.

Occupied by other settlers and then vacant and neglected for years, this weather-beaten structure was carefully renovated in 1936 by Dr. Arthur Limouze, who presented it to the Board of National Missions of the Presbyterian Church in 1941.

In 1979, the Narcissa Prentiss house was incorporated as a non-profit, under the University of the State of New York, and under the direction of the Committee to Preserve the Narcissa Prentiss House, which is registered with the IRS as a 501 (c)3 organization. Donations are always welcome.

In 1998, Narcissa Prentiss was reconized by the Governor's Commission honoring the achievements of New York women.

The Pick Edwards Community Center/Woodhull Museum is housed in a former Methodist Church in Woodhull, NY. This building was constructed prior to 1900 and has a colorful story in it's history.

The Church, now on the corner of West Main Street and Jasper Street, was initially located 1/8 mile up the road. The congregation wished to move the building closer to town where it currently sits by Tuscarora Creek, a great task for the relatively large building. Milo (Pick) Edwards a local well known building mover was hired for the job for \$175.00. Pick listened to weeks of discussion by the Church Leaders as to how this was to be done, the cost involved and the risk to the building. At the end of his patience, Mr. Edwards took it upon himself to move the building in the dead of night; The town went to sleep on a Friday night and awoke the next morning to find the church in it's current location.

The Town of Woodhull purchased this building 4 years ago. The building houses the museum and activity center. It is also the headquarters of Woodhull's Food Pantry.

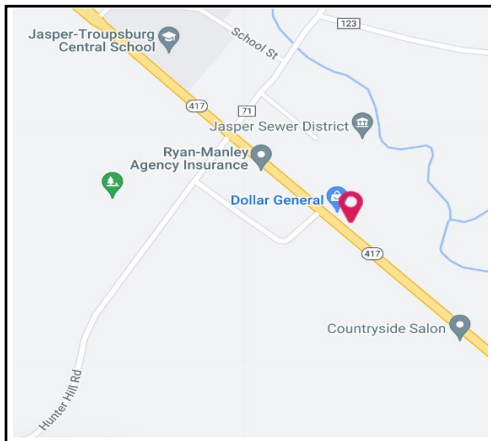

Ed Countryman a Jasper native was born in 1872. He was an expert photographer, working for Eastman Kodak Co. of Rochester traveling throughout the west. He was well versed in Indian Lore and was adopted by a tribe and a collector of Indian Artifacts.

To display his collection, he had the "Wigwams" built in the early 1930s. It has teepee like structures in each of the four corners. Here he sold gas and opened up a restaurant employing local residents and specializing in bear meat up until 1938. During the 1940s, you could enjoy a cheap drink and 10¢ hotdogs on a Sunday afternoon while watching Jasper's baseball team on the diamond behind the Wigwam.

For a time, it was a meeting place for the "Spiritual Guidance Church" then became a gift shop. In 1995, it was given to the Jasper Historical Society to be used as a museum.

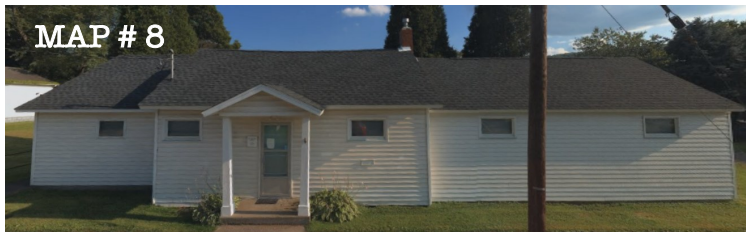

The Kanona & Prattsburgh Railroad Company laid 11.44 miles of rail for opening day in October of 1889. E. K. Derrick was contracted to build the depot in Wheeler Center (4 mile marker) along with grading for the siding and building the coal house. One could purchase their train ticket, send or receive a telegram, and pick up their postal mail at the depot. March 9, 1929 passenger service ended and the last train to run the tracks was September 29, 1959. After the 1961 auction, the depot was left vacant until the late 1980's when it was purchased and then changed owners four times over the next fifteen years and was left in bad repairs. Restoration of the depot was started in 2019. Working for a 2024 opening to be open the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month from 11:00 a.m. 'til 3:00 p.m. Home of the K&P/PRC museum and office of the Town Historian.

In the month of December 1936, the residents of 26 districts voted and overwhelmingly decided to centralize the rural school districts. With the help of a grant of \$99,000 construction was started in December 1937 for the erection of a new school building - the Avoca Central School, built on the same site as the Union School on Oliver St.

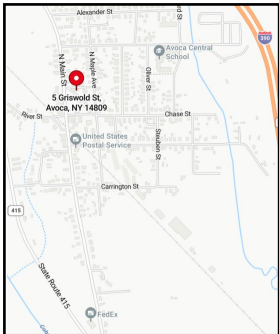
The Avoca Public Library was in need of an appropriate home, with 2776 books listed and cared for on the second floor of the Schmidt block, and the books were not available to all who wanted to borrow them. In 1938, the Avoca Free Library purchased the Wheeler District #7 rural schoolhouse on Wagner Hill for \$75. The building was moved to 5 Griswold St. in 1938 from the Walsh farm on a flatbed truck by Aloysius John Walsh. Over the years, the building was enlarged and improved.

The Avoca Historical Society was established in August of 1989. The first President was William Hunt, Town of Avoca Historian was Grace S. Fox, and Village Historian was Wayne Harris. The Avoca Free Library moved from 6 Griswold St. to N. Main St. in the former Bank of Avoca building in 2006. The Avoca Historical Society then acquired the former Library building at 5 Griswold St. Art Wightman built the display cases and with the assistance of a few members the interior was remodeled to be used for our museum. Judith Wightman became Curator of the museum and became the Historian in 2016, still serving positions today.

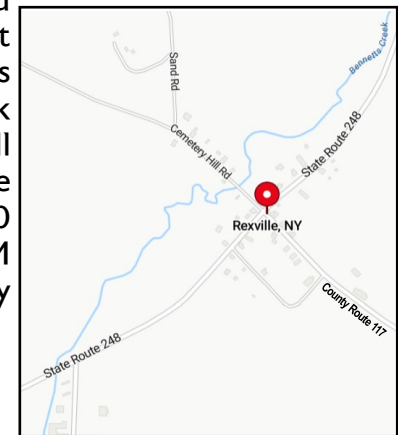

Our little West Union museum is located in the southwest corner of Steuben County next to the Allegany County line. Our Museum is small in size but packed with history you usually don't see. For example we have some unique things. A two sided 4 foot by 5 foot cut glass sign of a deer up a tree that used to hang in our town. We have a dog treadmill to turn butter. A brass bell from 1901 that hung in the tower of one of our school houses (school house 7). A piece of steel that came from the windmill that burnt in our town it was 636 feet high (the highest built in the US). We have a section dedicated to our one room schoolhouses. A display of the NYP railroad. This is inside. Outside we have a hand crafted steel gazebo and a 36 foot arched steel walk bridge that was handmade by a local gentleman back in the day. We also have a small display of farm equipment from the day. My hours are Mondays 6 to 7:30 PM and Thursdays from 6 to 7:30 PM or any time by appointment. My phone number is 607-225-4444.

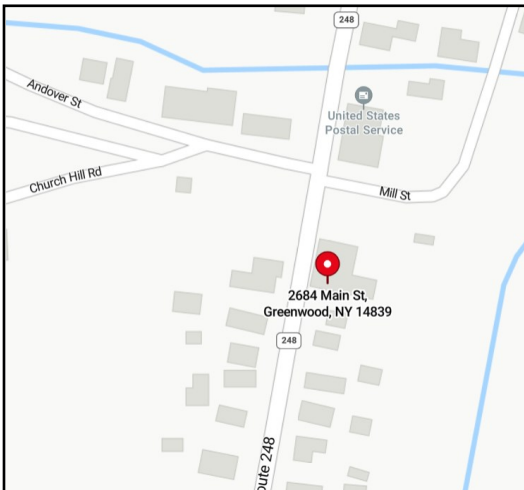

As a General Merchandise Store, Arthur Woodward and Frank Young built the structure that sits on the property in 1906. All the wood came from the sawmill owned by Woodward.

Woodward and Young became Young and Young upon Arthur Woodward's death in 1912 and remained family owned and operated by first Frank and his sister, Ellen; then Ellen and Grace, Frank's daughter, until 1966.

In the early 1980's, the Young Family donated the building to the town with the expressed requirement that the Historical Society be allowed to keep a museum in the storefront.

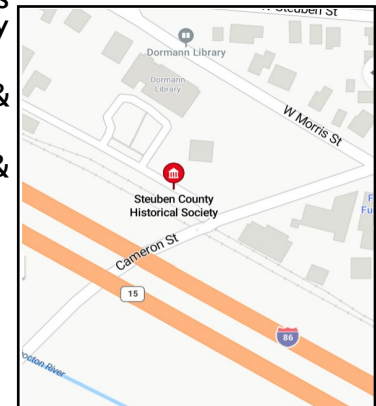
John Magee, who had served in the Revolutionary war, came to Steuben County in 1816. He engaged in farming, became Sheriff, Federal Marshall for Steuben County and was elected to Congress. His business interests included Railroads, coal and banking. When he married his second wife in 1831, he built this Greek-revival style house for her. They raised 10 children in the house.

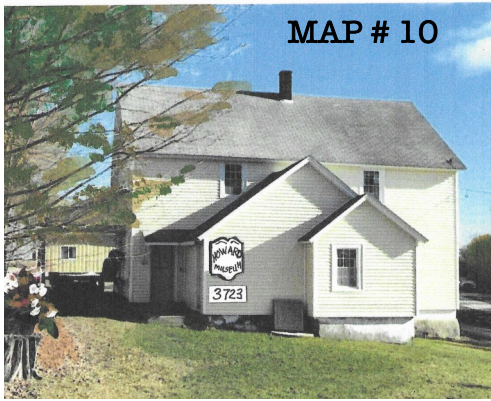
In 1893, the house was sold to Ira Davenport Jr. who allowed the Bath Library to move into the house. He willed the house to the library upon his death in 1904. It served as the Bath Davenport Library until 1999 when the new library was built. At that time, the Steuben County Historical Society took a 50-year lease to use the Magee House as its headquarters. Extensive improvements were done by the SCHS a few years ago assuring a continued future for the society and this lovely building. Currently, one side of the main floor is rented to the Steuben County Historian.

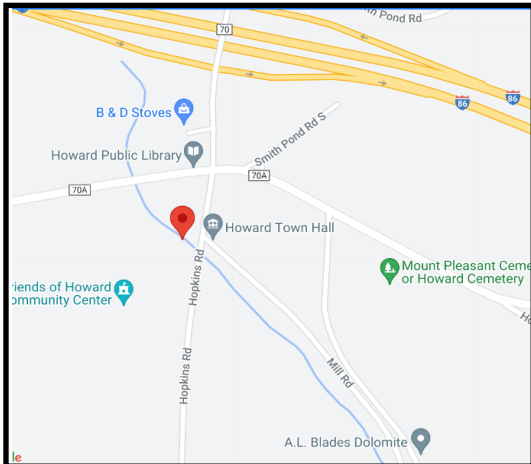

The Howard museum building was originally a Cheese Factory starting in 1911 at the corner of Hopkins and Mill Roads in the Town of Howard. In 1938 the town became owners and the Library moved into the old engine room. The town used a larger

room for their meeting. The town and library both moved to different buildings thus allowing the building to be used by the Historical Society as a Museum in 1977.

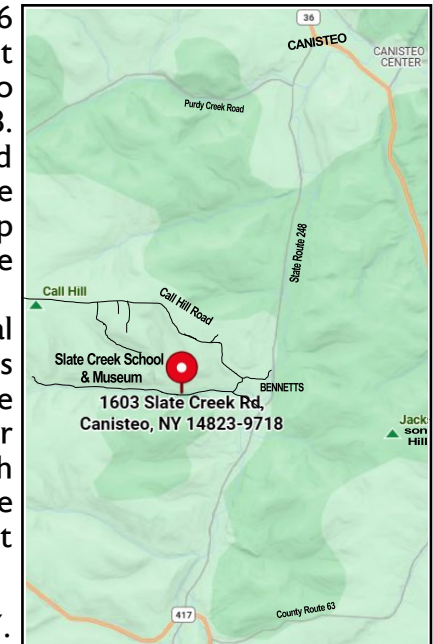

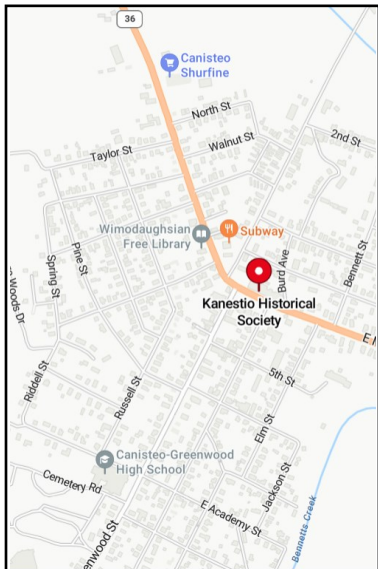

MISSION STATEMENT: The purpose of the society shall be to collect, preserve and share our local history. Our society was formed in 1985 by the dedicated efforts of the founding officers (Virginia Dickey, Betty Dennis & Marjorie VanHying) along with many faithful supporters with the goal of securing a building to house our collections. In 1994 we purchased the lot at 23 Main Street. With tremendous community support, financial assistance and donated skilled labor from talented craftsmen led by retired mason Jim Dineen, we were able to hold our first meeting in our completed building on March 21, 1995. In January 2014 our furnace overheated causing a devastating fire resulting in severe damage. The building had to be gutted and the interior completely redone. 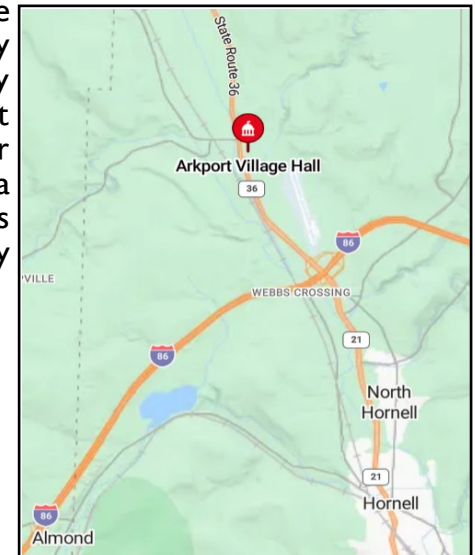

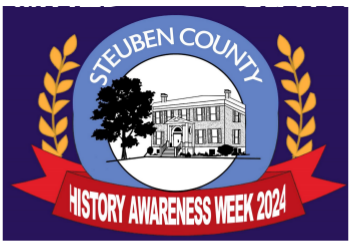
