BANDITRY AGAIN IS DISMAL FAILURE FOR MAIL TRAIN ROBBER

Mystery of Holdup on Long Island Solved in Arrest of Former Postal Clerk, James Cadoo

NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—Mystery surrounding the hold-up of a mail train on the Long Island railroad Tuesday night with a few miles of New York and Chief of \$10,000 being shipped by a Bellmore bank apparently was solved today with the arrest of James J. Cadoo of Lynbrook, N. Y., a former postal clerk, who stole a mail train of \$10,000, and four miles later held up the mail clerk, John P. Greene, at the point of a pistol. The robber stole a pouch of mail containing a shipment of \$10,000 from the Bellmore National Bank and leaped from the train.

For three days search for the robber was without avail. It was thought that Gerald Chapman, notorious bandit, was responsible. Green identified his picture as that of the robber, but police were skeptical. Meanwhile, Captain Chabert of the Lynbrook police force was looking for an automobile which had been seen near the scene of the hold-up. Early today he traced it to Cadoo's home and after brief questioning the prisoner was arrested.

Man Who Flooded Year
Battlefield and Saved
Allies' Fleet Is Dead

BRUSSELS, Belgium, Jan. 17.—(By A. P.)—Henri Gervais, book keeper of the slavers of the "Holland," a Dutch ship, was the first battle of the year, died in a hospital today after a long illness. He was 47 years old, when he was seized near the coast of Belgium, and was the cross of the Knight of the Order of Leopold in recognition of his services for the opening of the dikes in November 1914, flooding the Yser battlefield and stopping the German advance. The honor award was made by the king of Belgium.

BOOTLEGGERS, NOT BUYERS FOR PERSONAL USE, DRAWING ATTENTION OF PRESIDENT

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—Legislation to make jail sentences mandatory for prohibition law violation is being considered by President Coolidge to involve excessive punishment.

Such legislation now is before

With respect to it, the president takes the position, that as there are degrees in the seriousness of prohibition violations, discretion as between fine and jail sentence, or as to both, should be allowed the courts.

Possession of liquor in a flask, although a violation of the law, is not to the mind of Mr. Coolidge a serious offense, but on the other hand, possession of liquor for illicit sale is a serious matter.

The chief executive would not


