21 LOST WHEN U.S. PATROL BOAT IS SUNK BY SUB

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—The sinking of the American patrol boat Alcedo by a German submarine early Monday morning with the loss of one officer and 20 enlisted men was reported by the Navy Department with deep regret but not with surprise. The daily report sent to the Department by Vice Admiral Sims has led officials here to believe that German submarine warfare is becoming more and more intensive than ever before.
