\$450,000 Issue for Northside High School Will Bring \$10,495 Premium

George B. Gibbons & Co., New York City are the successful bidders for the bonds valued at \$450,000 issued by the Board of Education of District No. 13 to the new Northside High School on Kingsbury Plot. There were four bids offered, altogether, ranging from \$100,000 to \$102,21, figured on a \$100 basis, the latter price being the amount offered by the George Gibbons & Co. with interest at 4 1/2 per cent. dating from March 1.

The sealed bids were opened last evening before the members of the Board of Education called together for the purpose. The net value of the bonds was \$450,000 and were of \$1,000 denomination. The premium on the entire issue, total \$10,495. Making a grand total of \$460,495. The premium on each \$1,000 is \$23.10.

SOCIAL SERVICE UNIT GIVES MONTH'S REPORT FOR CITY BETTERMENT

Relief of Unfortunate Conditions Brought About by Society; Secure Oral Hygienist for Schools

The report of the Social Service Society of Corning for the month of February shows an active, ever-developing growth for the betterment of the city and the relief of unfortunate conditions. The main accomplishment of the organization during the month was the actual beginning of the work of the oral hygienist in the schools of the city.

Development of this work during the past month in only the first two grades of each school has shown a surprising need for this sort of service in the community that has surpassed the estimates made by those who thought they had summed up the situation. The number of children with perfect teeth has been very small.

The reports of the Social Service Society, the Dental Hygienist, and the Committee on Tuberculosis and Public Health, are the main accomplishments of the month. The committee on Tuberculosis and Public Health states that not all the Christians in the city are accounted for, some recipients of the aid of the Social Service Society for the month of February 1926.

The outstanding feature of the work of the Social Service Society for the month of February was the actual starting to work of the oral hygienist in the schools. The salary is from the Social Seal Funds, the equipment is lent by the City, but through the Board of Health. This service will reach all schools in the city. A separate report of this first month's work is submitted.

The Clinic for Crippled Children commences work in the first year, but to Elmsira more frequently. During the month a child was taken to this clinic for examination and advice. It is going to be necessary to have another specialist however as she presents a most unusual case.

Cooperating with the school nurse in her health work, three health films were brought to Corning and through the generosity of the management of the Princess Theatre a free movie was possible one Saturday morning. Five hundred children from six, eighth and fifth grades saw the film, "The Knowing Game," "The Prince and the Pauper," "The Princess and the Pea," and "The Princess and the Frog." The Social Service Society also presented a comedy film made to the delight of the children. The program was the present giving to the success of the affair.

There have been visits to Corning by and from nurses with field workers from the State Charities Aid Association, Infantile Paralysis Division, State Department of Health, and Dr. Curran's Clinic.

Evening hours have been held once a week through the month and there have been several committee meetings to discuss Camp Affairs and the work of Dental Hygiene.

In addition to these general phases of work of Family Welfare, the Society has been busy with interested in 57 families. They have come to the City Nurses, the School Nurse, the City Welfare Board, Private Physicians, Employment Bureau, Town Societies, and the Travelers Aid Society and the Red Cross. These problems have been met in part by acute illness, chronic illness, 2 accident 1, maternity, drug addiction 1, the Social Service Society is not sufficient to itself but works in cooperation with all social agencies in City and Nation. The committee met its clients. During February we sought the co-operation of the Overseas of the Poor, the City Nurses, the School nurse, Crippled Children's Clinic, the Clinic for Mental Defect, County Superintendent of the Poor, the Supervisors, Juvenile Court, Out of Town Societies, relatives and friends of our clients, and the Catholic Daughters of America.

One hundred and five visits were made to homes and 76 phone calls and conferences and 100 were received from clients or representatives of the co-operating agencies assisting. Relief to the amount of \$130.37 was spent from General Fund for clothing, food, fuel, house rent, medicines needed to assist families in distress. \$12.02 was given to be administered for the family to which it was given. Forty-four letters were written in behalf of our clients.

A separate report is presented for the activities of the Committee on Tuberculosis and Public Health and also for the work of the Dental Hygienist.

Report of Dental Hygienist to Committee:

"Since the first of February the Dental Hygienist has come and started to work. Following the suggestion of the Committee a letter was addressed to the Board of Health asking their cooperation in securing the loan of Dental equipment and the use of the schools. The Board of Health approved the request and immediately loaned the loan to the Committee and as a result the sum of \$210.00 was set aside for the purchase of equipment.
